Hand/Arm Transplantation – Question Prompt Sheet

Many people with upper limb loss have questions or concerns that they want to discuss with their healthcare team. During busy clinic visits people may forget to ask their questions. We created this question sheet to help you get the information that you want about hand/arm transplantation.

The questions on this list are organized by topic. Some questions may matter more to you than others. You can use this list to help you remember what to ask the transplant team.

Circle the questions that you want answers to or write down your own questions before your clinic visit. Plan to ask your most important questions first. One visit may not be long enough to cover all of your questions.
